Logistics is the complex process of moving goods from one place to another.

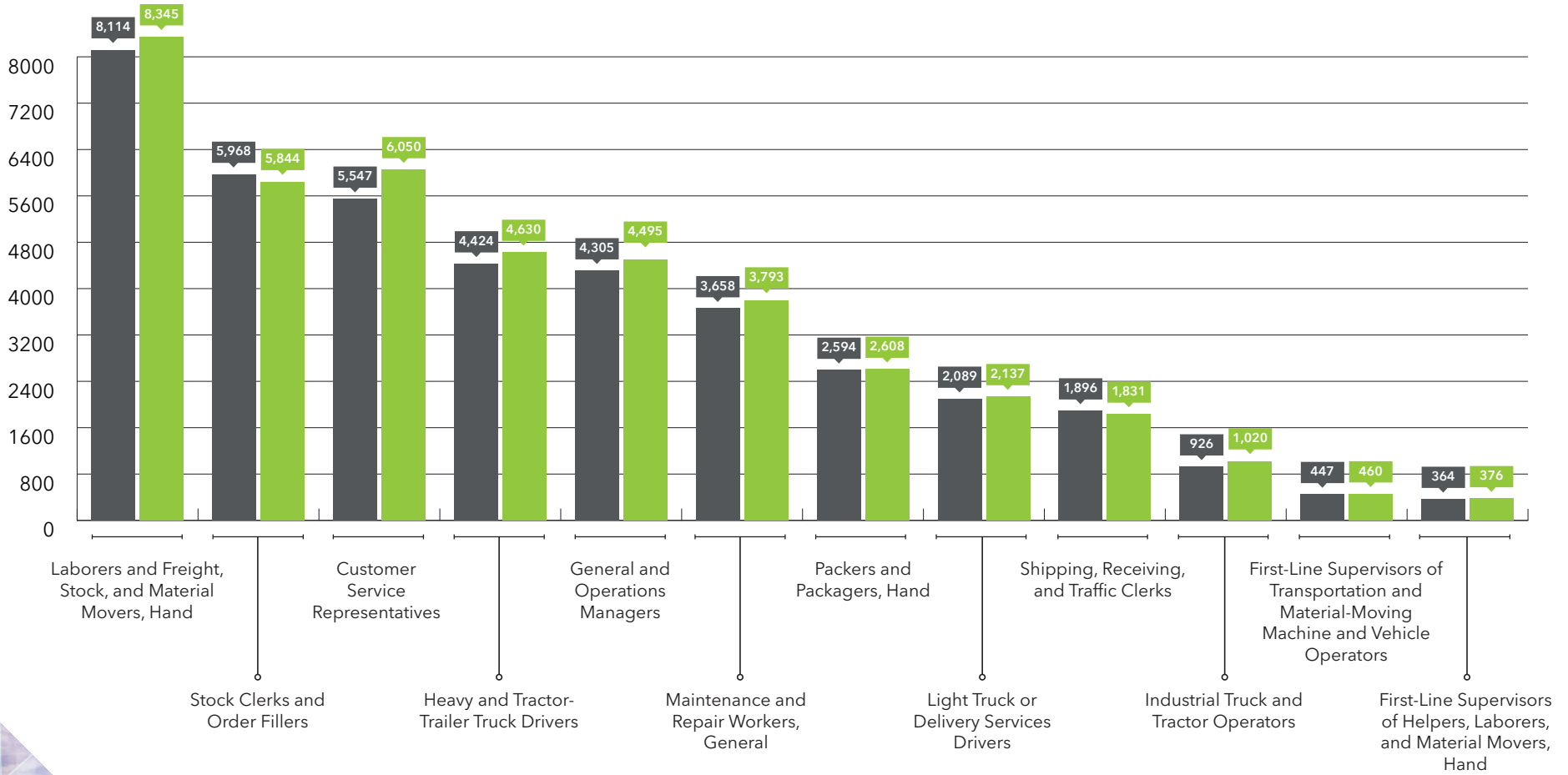
